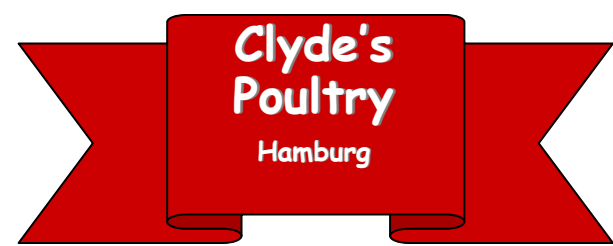

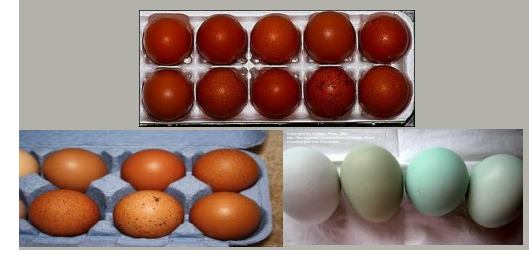

Rhode Island Red		Dark reddish brown in color. From day old to 20 weeks, pullets will consume about 17 lbs. feed. They mature rapidly and lay for months on end. Excellent layer of dark brown egg even during winter. Egg Production 200-280 eggs per year	Welsummer		Welsummers are named after the village of Welsum in Holland where they originated. They are famous for their large, dark, terracotta-brown eggs. They have a wonderful disposition.
Australorp		This chicken breed makes an excellent winter laying hen. They are known for their shiny rich black feathering. Always make sure you have shady areas for the Black Australorp chicken so they do not overheat in the summer.	Black Jersey Giants		Jersey Giants, which are very attractive, are the largest of the dual-purpose breeds. They grow very slowly and are a poor choice for the production of broiler meat; however, the hens may be expected to weigh 9 pounds and are a good producer of brown shelled eggs.
Easter Egger		Baby: comes in all colors just like mature birds. Mature: Easter egg chick. Medium size with pea combs. Come in a variety of color patterns. Extremely hardy. Recommended for laying and not exhibition. Lay blue-green shade egg from turquoise to deep olive. Egg Production 200-280 eggs per year	Cuckoo Maran		It is a dual purpose bird and is known for its deep chocolate brown eggs though some eggs may have some speckled dark pigments in the egg shell.
Buff Orpington		Baby: soft light buff. Mature: pure golden in color. Large bird with a quiet disposition. Can take the cold well. Good for eating and make excellent setters. Good brown egg layer. Weight: Female 6.5 lbs. Male 8 lbs. Egg Production 200-280 eggs per year	Golden Comet		The Golden Comet Chickens are one of 2 Modern Day Brown egg laying strains from hybrid breeding that produce fast body development and fast egg production. These strains will start to lay eggs at a younger age than most standard breeds and produce big brown eggs.
Speckled Sussex		This variety of the Sussex breed makes for a good backyard chicken and dual purpose for meat or egg production. This bird is a very good layer and handles confinement well. Their speckled coloring makes them blend in with the background and camouflages them from predators such as coyotes, and foxes. They molt year and more speckles appear so they become even more colorful the older they get.	Delaware		The Delaware makes an excellent dual-purpose bird. They have an excellent lay rate, and a calm and friendly disposition. The breed is noted for rapid growth and fast feathering of the chicks.
Light Brahma		Light Brahma chickens are exceptionally quiet, gentle, and easy to handle. Their small pea comb, great size, and heavy plumage make them almost immune to cold weather.	Wyandottes		Originated in New York State and is the parent variety of the all of the other Wyandottes. The Silver Laced Wyandotte chickens are a docile bird, clean legs, Mostly black laced silvery white feathers and black tail; Red rose comb, earlobes, and wattles.
