Chicks arrive a few days old and **MUST** be kept under a heat light for several weeks depending on when you get them.

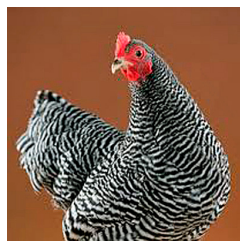

New Hampshire Red



NH Reds are derived from RI Reds but mature quicker. Slightly larger than RI Reds & we find them to be of better temperament. Good layer of large brown eggs. Adaptable to cold & home flock conditions.

Plymouth Barred Rocks



Super popular for backyard flocks because they are dependable layers of big eggs. These big girls are mellow and friendly. Developed in Massachusetts in the 1800s - so cold isn't an issue!

Cinnamon Queen



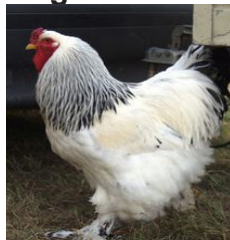
If you want great egg production these are your girls! Lays sooner than other breeds - smaller overall bird consumes less feed while producing large brown eggs. Excellent choice for backyard egg production.

Buff Orpington



Big, round & gold! These large birds are known for easy-going personalities and their egg-laying ability - even in the cold winter months. From the UK

Light Brahma



Customer Favorite! This big bird has feathering on its legs & feet for fun look. Great big bird that lays well - Very cold hearty. Tends to be friendly.

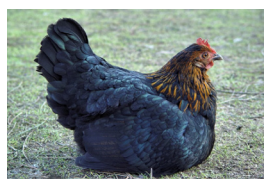

Black Sex-Link (Black Stars)



This bird is a cross of RI Reds & Barred Rocks - giving you the best of both breeds! Fabulous for free-ranging - tough birds that are prolific layers. Sex-link breeds mean the females & male are different colors - easy to tell the sex!

*Our layer chicks are females - sexed at the hatchery with 90% success rate.

*You can have a variety of breeds in your flock - no need to stick to just one breed! We recommend at least 2 per breed or one chick of many individual breeds so that there isn't an "odd man out, who would most likely get picked on."

*Minimum order is 4 chicks. Breeds often sell out - so try to get your order in early.

*Hens will begin to lay when they are about 18-20 weeks old. When hens are at peak production they will lay about 1 egg per day.

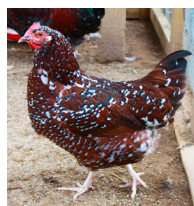

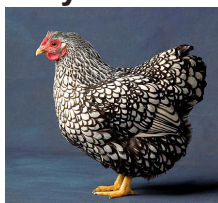

Speckled Sussex



Popular in England because it is such a good layer & meat bird. Easy to handle, curious and friendly, great foragers. Develops more speckles with each molt. Limited Supply

Silver Laced Wyandotte



Sharp looking bird! The original Wyandotte - good layer of large eggs, cold hardy and docile. Great foragers but also adapt to coops well. Nice birds!

Delaware



Rare breed - listed as Critical Status for Heritage breeds. Great layer extra large eggs, grows quickly, can be used as meat bird. Limited Supply

Welsummers



Pretty brown birds that lay dark-colored eggs often with spots. A hen will lay the same general egg pattern throughout life. Active birds - good free-range. Limited Supply.
